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INT. KITCHEN - NIGHT

He has an impish look on his face.

LESTER

Enter ALICE (80), walking with determination. She is wearing GARDENING GLOVES. She stops abruptly, looks at Lester, and rolls her eyes.

ALICE

Is the shouting really necessary?

LESTER

You're old, woman. I have to get through those hearing aids somehow!

ALICE

You scared me half to death!

LESTER

Well I'm still closer than you-

Alice's face washes over with anger, then grief. Lester's smile slowly leaves his face.

LESTER

-wrong audience. Anyway, look what came in the mail!

ALICE

How many times have I told you not to go through the mail?

LESTER

In the 57 years we've been married, probably once every day, and twice a day on holidays...

Alice glares at him.

ALICE

Let's review. You can't go through the mail because-

LESTER

-because every time I see something cool I order it online without telling you and then forget about it after a week and leave it in the garage. Okay, I get it. But in my defense how crazy is it that you are just three clicks away from the very thing you see in the picture?

ALICE

Not as crazy as I'll be if my flowers die of dehydration while we're standing here.

LESTER

Just look, sassypants!

Lester hands Alice the pamphlet. He is beaming. Alice looks at it cautiously for a few seconds.

ALICE

A carnival! How...fun! I'll let the kids know, seeing as how THEIR kids are more age appropriate, NOT ours.

LESTER

Not just any carnival, THE carnival! Remember? Car-nih-valle!

Alice tries to fight a smile. She giggles while trying to speak confidently.

ALICE

I don't know what you're talking about!

LESTER

Really? Well, let's review.

Lester takes TWO FLOWERS out of the VASE, walks up to Alice, and holds it out to her.

LESTER

(in a fake, heavily Americanized Italian accent) Ciao, Principessa! Tu sei una bellissima donna! Piu bella di

questi fiori. Per te!

Alice can no longer fight her smile. She blushes and takes the flowers.

Okay, okay, you shameful Italian man. Had I known you weren't really Italian, that NEVER would have worked!

LESTER

Hey, when a handsome stranger hands you flowers on a ferris wheel, you take them! You can translate later.

ALICE

Duly noted. If I'm ever on a ferris wheel with a handsome stranger, I'll take your advice.

LESTER

I'm going to let that one slide because we are about to go on the best second first-date ever! I can't believe they're coming! I mean, can you believe the timing? We HAVE to get on that ferris wheel!

Alice's smile becomes forced. She slowly turns away from Lester, and begins to take off her gloves.

ALICE

It's great that they're coming. I'll tell the kids. They'll be thrilled.

LESTER

Forget the kids, Al! We're going back 57 years to when it all started. You asked me what I wanted. Well, this is it! I want to be on top of the world with the woman I've loved since I first saw her on that ferris wheel.

ALICE

I have a lot of gardening to do, Lester. I wish we could go, but I've got to tend to the vegetables this weekend. It's supposed to storm on Sunday, and I have to make sure they're grounded and stable...

LESTER

We can do that today! And tomorrow! We didn't retire for nothing! Come (MORE)

LESTER (CONT'D)

on, Al, wouldn't it be fun? For old time sake?

ALICE

We don't need to go to old times. We have new times to look forward to. I was just thinking, would you prefer our Annual Adventure to take place in the Spring or around October? I was thinking Thailand, too, because I know how much you love elephants...

LESTER

I think this weekend, at the ferris wheel, is all the time I have to look forward to.

ALICE

Or maybe Greece, I hear the people are sweet...

LESTER

I hear the cotton candy is sweet at the carnival...

Alice throws the pamphlet into the trash.

ALICE

We're not going! We don't have time. I'm sorry Les. There's just not enough time.

Alice dries her hands furiously, and walks out of the room. Lester painfully watches her leave. He reaches into the trash to retrieve the pamphlet. He smooths it out on the counter top, and opens it again.

INT. LIVING ROOM - DAY

Lester is on the COMPUTER, typing slowly. A couple of clicks later, an AMUSEMENT PARK THEME SONG begins to play. Lester jumps out of his chair. He is beaming.

LESTER

Aaaaaalice! Oh, Alice!

Alice rushes in breathlessly. Her expression quickly changes from flustered to angry.

What is wrong with you?

LESTER

Nothing! Those hearing aids, on the other hand-

ALICE

-I'm going to turn down the volume on my hearing aids to drown you out. Then maybe you'll see the fault in your ways.

LESTER

You can drown me out, but you can't drown out the music!

Lester turns up the volume on the computer.

ALICE

Try me.

LESTER

Dance with me.

ALICE

No.

LESTER

Aw, come on, Al. I figured out how to work The Youtube just to play this song! That Youtube is a tricky little bastard, but I've finally figured it out! One more thing to knock off my bucket list. Speaking of, my list is growing increasingly time constricting-

Alice interjects desperately.

ALICE

-because you keep adding to it!

Lester smiles half-heartedly.

LESTER

Yeah, that's right.

ALICE

You know, as impressive as your accomplishment is...and trust me, I'm so proud, I have to finish planting the vegetables. If you

(MORE)

ALICE (CONT'D)

want your garden to be as extravagant as it was last year, it's going to take a lot of care for the next couple of months...

LESTER

Screw the next couple of months! Dance with me now, woman!

ALICE

(sarcastically)

As difficult as it is to resist your charm...

LESTER

Just as difficult as the day we met. You could not get enough of me.

ALICE

My date begged to differ.

LESTER

Well, where is he now, huh? Come on, dance with me!

Alice smirks bashfully.

ALICE

You're not supposed to move too much with your arthritis.

LESTER

Why do you love reminding me how old I am?

Although Lester was clearly joking, Alice's face softens.

ALICE

You're forever young in my eyes, Lester.

LESTER

Prove it.

Lester spins Alice, pulls her in, and dances with her. She giggles and blushes. He pulls her closer, until his lips are up to her ear.

LESTER

Sei bellissima! Mia principessa! Si sente odore del suolo...

If you think dirty talking in Italian is going to get me...

LESTER

I told you you smell like soil.

ALICE

It doesn't get much dirtier than that!

LESTER

Ah, that's what you think! Just wait until we're on the love machine...

ALICE

If you're referring to the ferris wheel-

LESTER

-obviously.

Lester rolls his eyes at his last comment and smiles. Alice is still flushed.

ALICE

We are not going! And we are certainly not going act like this if we go! There are children everywhere!

LESTER

They won't hear us! We'll be on top of the world.

ALICE

You want to feel like you're on top of the world? Because I've been reading about the mountains in Switzerland, and they look beautiful. I was thinking this Christmas, our Vacation Destination could be...

LESTER

Our Vacation Destination should be the top of that ferris wheel!

ALICE

Where is the adventure in that?

LESTER

We can take an adventure back in time. Scare kids. Be the people we are in our souls. Everything is an adventure with you.

ALICE

(sarcastically)

Then adventure with me to the garden, where the mysterious carrots will one day sprout!

LESTER

Don't be sarcastic towards a dying man. It's bad karma.

Alice pulls away from Lester. Her eyes fill with tears.

ALICE

You're not dying. Turn off that damn music, and get that ferris wheel out of your head.

LESTER

(apologetically)

Okay. Honey?

ALICE

What.

LESTER

You're forever young in my eyes, too.

ALICE

I'll be in the garden.

Lester walks dejectedly toward the computer, and turns the music off. Alice exits the room, and Lester moves to sit on the couch. He is holding his back in pain. He lays down slowly, and begins to hum the same amusement park theme song that was just playing. He closes his eyes.

INT. RESTAURANT - LATE AFTERNOON

Lester and Alice are sitting at a table. Alice is looking at the menu. Lester is looking at Alice. He is beaming.

LESTER

Aaal-

What?

LESTER

You look beautiful tonight.

ALICE

You already told me that. I've always been good at accepting compliments, but the same one over and over again is a bit suspicious.

LESTER

Can't a guy let his wife know he's still attracted to her?

Enter WAITER.

WAITER

Are you guys ready to order?

ALICE

I'll have the pasta, thank you.

LESTER

(seductively)

I'll have what she's having.

The waiter smiles and collects their menus. Alice smiles at Lester.

ALICE

You dirty old man.

LESTER

Hey, I'm not dead yet.

Alice sinks into her chair. Tears rush to her eyes. She fights to stop them.

ALICE

Would you stop joking about that? It's not funny.

LESTER

I think it's pretty funny.

ALICE

It's not. Your sense of humor was always over the top. Remember the first time you met my mother, you-

LESTER

-Alice, I wanted to ask-

ALICE

(continuous)

-were so nervous about making a
good impression-

LESTER

(continuous)

-I know you keep saying no-

ALICE

(continuous)

-you thought it would be funny to-

LESTER

(continuous)

-But we should go to-

ALICE

-ENOUGH WITH THE CARNIVAL. You can't go. And you can't get on the ferris wheel. Because the second we get off, that's it. You let go. You may be ready to leave me, but I'm not ready to let you leave. So stop being so selfish, and leave the carnival alone.

Lester takes Alice's hand from across the table. She is crying.

LESTER

The timing is tragic, because we have so much life left to live. But until that day comes I want to take you in as much as possible, so all I'll have left when I go is your smile, not sadness. All you'll have left is your memory, which can be so much stronger if we go out and adventure now, in our own way, while we still can. I want you to remember a happy, loving man, who stole your heart that night fifty years ago on the ferris wheel. And I want to do it again one last time.

Alice wipes the tears from her eyes. She looks around, blushes, and then composes herself.

ALICE

Remember that one time we dine-and-dashed?

LESTER

We did what?

ALICE

DASH!

Alice runs out of the restaurant. Lester runs after her, laughing.

EXT. CARNIVAL - SUNDOWN

Lester is holding open the gate to one of the ferris wheel cars. He takes Alice's hand and helps her climb in.

LESTER

Step right up, mia principessa, for the adventure of a lifetime! It will cost you one ki-

Alice kisses Lester as the ride begins to carry them up.

LESTER

You can't resist the charm! Couldn't then, couldn't now.

Alice blushes.

ALICE

Shut up.

They reach the top of the ride. Lester leans in close to Alice.

LESTER

Welcome, Alice, to the top of the world.
