GABE

DOCTOR

GABE

The doctor makes her way to the door and exits the room. Gabe goes to the window and looks out at all the trees and cars. He begins to lightly cry before he notices the full body mirror on the wall. CATHERINE

GABE

CATHERINE

GABE

INT./EXT. CAR - DAY

How do you feel?

GABE

It's impossible to describe. It's like, I've always known about these things but finally seeing them...there's no way to experience everything the same way without being able to see them. It's incredible.

CATHERINE

It's not overwhelming?

GABE

No, it is. But in the best possible way.

CATHERINE

I'm glad you feel so great about it. I have to say, it's a little weird that you finally know what I look like.

Gabe stops looking out the windows and looks over to her.

GABE

It's weird knowing what I look like.

They share a laugh together as the song on the radio finishes and a new one emerges from the speakers.

CATHERINE

I imagine Alana is crazy excited to see you this weekend.

GABE

She doesn't know yet. About the operation.

CATHERINE

You haven't told her about your visits to the doctor and getting the surgery?

GABE

Nope.

When you asked me not talk to her about it, I thought you were just scared that I'd make the whole thing out to be something bad. But you know I'd never do that right? I do support you on this, I have since the first time you brought it up.

GABE

No I know. It wasn't that. I just wanted it to be a surprise.

CATHERINE

Yeah she's going to be surprised.

GABE

She's not going to be mad at me, you don't think?

CATHERINE

No, Alana's always loved it when we make big decisions without telling her, the divorce being one.

Gabe stares out the window for a second, silent.

CATHERINE

Gabe, I'm joking. She's going to be happy. She's coming tomorrow around noon right?

GABE

Yeah.

CATHERINE

She'll be excited.

Gabe doesn't respond and they continue along the road.

INT. GABE'S HOUSE LIVING ROOM - DAY

The front door of the house opens and Gabe and Catherine enter. Catherine is holding a box of items such as photos, books, and other random objects. Gabe walks around his house for the first time. He runs his fingers along a painting of the ocean that hangs on the wall.

GABE

The ocean. That's what I have to see next.

Catherine puts the box on the couch and begins to take off her sweatshirt. As she pulls it above her head, her stomach is shown and Gabe notices a scar by her belly button.

GABE

That scar. Is that from the C-section?

Catherine uses her hand to keep her shirt above the scar as she looks at it.

CATHERINE

Uh yeah.

Gabe steps up next to Catherine and holds his hand out to her stomach.

GABE

Do you mind?

CATHERINE

No go ahead.

Gabe gently rubs his fingers along the scar.

GABE

I spent years doing this, but actually seeing it is different. Our daughter came out of there.

Gabe stops rubbing the scar and looks up at Catherine who lets her shirt cover her stomach.

GABE

CATHERINE

GABE

INT. GABE'S HOUSE LIVING ROOM - DAY

Gabe's lying down on the couch looking at one of the books from Catherine's box. He has a mug of coffee sitting on the table next to him. He hears a knock at the door and goes to answer it. It's Catherine.

CATHERINE

Good morning.

GABE

Morning.

Catherine heads inside and Gabe follows behind her.

CATHERINE

You made yourself coffee?

GABE

Yeah, following the instructions wasn't so hard. You want some?

CATHERINE

Yeah that would be great, thanks.

Gabe and Catherine head into the kitchen.

INT. GABE'S HOUSE KITCHEN - DAY

Gabe goes over to the coffee machine and begins making Catherine a glass.

How'd you sleep?

GABE

Had my first dream. Well, first visual dream.

CATHERINE

I thought you've had dreams before?

GABE

Well yeah, but they were just noises and voices. This one actually had visuals with it.

CATHERINE

That's exciting. What was it about?

GABE

It was weird. I was standing by the couch, just like when you were here yesterday. And I heard a knock on the door. So I opened it but no one was there. I could hear Alana's voice though, she was talking to me like she had just come home from school for the summer. I couldn't see her but her voice went into the living room.

Gabe hands Catherine her cup of coffee and she begins to sip on it.

CATHERINE

GABE

GABE

GABE

Hey Honey...How are you doing?...I'm okay. I just wanted to see if you were on the road yet...Oh you are? I'm not sure if it's a good idea to be with you today. I'm not feeling very well...Yeah, I don't know what it is, maybe the flu...I'm sorry you drove all this way. I should have called earlier...How about you visit your mom before you head back to school?...I'm sorry again honey. I love you...Have a safe drive.

As Gabe is on the phone, Catherine comes outside and walks out to Gabe. Gabe hangs up the phone and looks at Catherine.

CATHERINE

Why did you get the surgery?

GABE

What?

CATHERINE

Why did you get the surgery? Why did you want to be able to see?

GABE

GABE

CATHERINE

GABE

CATHERINE

GABE

GABE

ALANA

ATIANA

GABE

ALANA
